Additional instructional time will allow students to develop the skills they need to be on the path to college and career. We prioritize time in our extended model on the core subjects. All students will be reading and writing at an above grade level by third grade. All will receive approximately 200 minutes of daily literacy instruction. That time will be used for a balanced literacy approach. Students will engage in interactive read aloud, shared reading, small group guided reading, and independent reading each day. Targeted guided reading provides students the opportunity for phonics work and word study, critical to the development of reading skills. A balanced approach between print and language learning opportunities is an accepted best practice supported by research and national literacy experts. We will provide targeted development and support to teachers so they can implement rigorous literacy instruction, guided by principles in Reading Reconsidered. We will incorporate close reading of challenging texts, so students develop into enthusiastic analytical readers. A love of literacy will be cultivated across classrooms and throughout the school community. Each classroom will have a library of books labeled by level and organized by genre or topic. All students will have independent reading books with them throughout the day. In addition to 200 minutes of daily literacy instruction, students will be expected to read at home every night; families will sign nightly student monitoring cards.
