

## TITLE I, Part A: Homeless Set-aside

### Guidance on Allowable and Unallowable Expenditures

Title I, Part A funds may be used to provide services to homeless children and youths, including those in Title I schools, that may not ordinarily be available to Title I students. To help homeless students effectively take advantage of educational opportunities, Title I, Part A funds to provide, where appropriate, items or services including, but not limited to the list below.

Services must be reasonable and necessary to assist homeless students to take advantage of

educational opportunities.

- Items of clothing and shoes necessary for participation in classes
- Student fees that are necessary to participate in the general education program
- Personal school supplies such as backpacks, notebooks, and remote learning devices such as internet and/or laptop/tablet
- The acquisition of birth certificates
- Immunizations
- Food
- Services
- Eyeglasses and hearing aids by the PTA) used to provide similar services for economically disadvantaged students.
- Counseling services related to homeless issues that are impeding learning
- Outreach services
- Extended learning time (before and after school, Saturday, summer)
- Extra-curricular activity fees
- Tutoring services, especially in shelters or other locations where homeless students are residing
- Parental involvement
- Fees for AP, IB, SAT/ACT, GED testing
